Dear New Life Friends,

Many of the women who lived at New Life Home two decades ago are now mothers with adult daughters. Confident, caring, spiritual, healthy, successful women, when asked where they would be today without New Life, eight-out-of-ten say "I would be dead." The others almost all add, "in prison."

Drawing on the power of their message, we've developed a new mission statement: "Saving Lives. Empowering Women."

It's a concise message for today's fast-paced world and we believe it synthesizes our mission in four impactful words. New Life Home helps women facing personal and spiritual crises as they work to overcome their struggles, including addictions to alcohol, street drugs (including heroin), prescription pain medications and destructive behaviors, many while struggling to care for young children.

If we changed our new mission statement at all, it would be to add "and children." But the message is clear. As you know, unlike other facilities, we don't believe in separating women from their children, if keeping these fragile families together is at all possible. Along with our Gospel-based programming, New Life Home's families-together model is unique.

For almost four decades, young women in crisis have recovered and then blossomed through the New Life Home recovery process, gaining strength, life skills and emotional stability through a disciplined residency program that balances traditional recovery models with a faith-based belief in Jesus and the restorative power of the Gospel.

In the coming months, aspects of our look and form of messaging may change; our mission and essential work will stay the same, and, with YOUR support, GROW!

Rescue Me Now

Over the next few months we will be sharing more about our long-term "Rescue Me Now" Campaign, which will run through May 2018. Our goals are ambitious and our hearts pure as we develop this fundraising initiative which will reach out to donors, community leaders and church leaders throughout our community as we work to build our endowment and, to put it as simply as possible, save more lives. New Life Home's "Rescue Me Now" goal is \$500,000, which will be used to:

- Shorten our waiting list, providing housing and faith-based recovery programming for more young women in crisis, as well as housing and support for their young children;
- Fund our meal plan, utilities and wages for our hardworking staff, and, ultimately...
- Provide funding for a third home in our region with room for more women in crisis, saving more lives through the power of the gospel.

In the coming months we'll be sharing more about "Rescue Me Now" and the ways in which you, your families and the other people in your lives can help us build this initiative.
