Dear New Life Friends,

As summer creeps away, we are reminded that even the earth likes to rest for a season. In New Hampshire, we look forward to the leaves changing colors, the winds getting colder, and the muffins getting pumpkin spicier. Each of these is an indication to us that things are slowing down, and winter will be here before we know it. We often don't want to examine the signs and we would be much more comfortable pretending that summer will go on and the challenges that autumn and winter create will not happen. But the longer you ignore the signs, the more difficult it becomes to catch up with the reality of the environment around you.

If we are honest, the environment around us seems to be getting tired, to be yearning for rest. People are begging for help and going out of their way to try and find comfort in anything they can get hold of. This has led to a record number of overdoses and a record number of applicants to our home. We are reminded each and everyday that the effects of autumn and winter are in full swing, that people are tired and desperately seeking rest, and that the lost world around us is yearning for someone to come down and save them. Over the summer we had to make the excruciating decision to stop interviews for three months in order to ensure we could offer the women and children who call a realistic idea of when we would be able to offer the help we provide. This is the first time in thirty-seven years that we had to make this difficult decision.

You might be amazed to know that stopping the interview process for those three months didn't stop the need, if anything it made it more obvious to us. We are assaulted each day through phones, e-mails, and social media from people begging for help. The cries sound like, "My daughter is in a detox and needs a place," or "My sister just admitted she struggles with alcohol," or "My mom needs a place, she cannot do it on her own." I share these cries with you not to burden you dear friend but to show you that the need is great and will overwhelm us if we allow it to.

And so we have to strategize as an organization and boldly ask, "Who will meet this need?" Who will be the ones to stand in the gap for the voiceless, who will stand in the gap for the ones society often throws away because the problems are overwhelming and the answers are slow to come? We will. We have purposed in our hearts that we will be part of God's rescue plan for a generation that is literally dying in the streets. What we have been willing to accept is enormous and overwhelming, but it's good. How can we hide in our homes and ignore the voice of the afflicted? How can we shrink back when we know God has given us the answer? John 4:11-13 says, "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?" Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." People are desperately thirsty, and are dying for a drink of living water. Thank you so very much for partnering with us to provide something that will stop them from continuing to thirst.

Please pray for us as we aggressively pursue the purchase of a third home in our area. We are out of places to take new ladies into the home. We have even gone so far as to convert an existing office into a bedroom so one more lady can enter the home, but the seams are bursting and the nets are full. Thank you for standing with us and helping us pull in these nets.
